

More than 300 items housed in a Georgian mansion will be sold in an auction with contents including 17th century furniture, ceramics and a series one [Land Rover](#) from 1958. Bishton Hall at Wolseley Bridge, Staffordshire, is described as a 'magnificent' 18th century country property and Derbyshire auctioneers are selling its contents in a five-day event. Antiques including classic portraits, ceramics and silver will be available to buy at the Grade II listed countryside building. The auction was announced after St Bedes Prep School - which ran in the hall - closed and Bishton Hall was bought by a party who plan to restore it as a functions venue.

The auction will take place at Bishton Hall (pictured) as people are given a first-hand glimpse of the 18th century mansion, which sits on one of Staffordshire's oldest settlements. This 1958 Land Rover is among the items up for sale at a five-day auction being held at the Grade II listed property after a third party bought the closed school within. A Carlo Moretti-style painting (left) shows a seated lady surrounded by cherubs and bidders will also have the chance to purchase statues currently sitting in the gardens, including the one pictured (right). This Anglo-Indian gilt lacquer chest dating back to the 19th century is expected to fetch up to £4,000 as hundreds of items contained in the house and its gardens are sold off to the highest bidders. This painting of The Grand Canal in Venice is expected to fetch up to £5,000 in the auction, which is being held over the course of five days in Staffordshire. An Anglo-Indian gilt lacquer chest dating back to the 19th century is expected to fetch up to £4,000 and a George III country oak sideboard is valued at up to £1,500.

The collection boasts paintings of an early 19th century English school, [tranh sơn mài phong cảnh tranh sơn mài phong cảnh](#) mài cửa huyền thất tổ a portrait of a woman in a white dress and a depiction of a lady in a green dress with her dog, Fluffkins, by German artist Fritz Von Kamptz. A portrait of a woman wearing a white dress (pictured, above the fireplace) will be sold alongside another depicting a woman with her pet dog, named Fluffkins, by the German painter Fritz Von Kamptz. A Carlo Moretti-style painting shows a seated lady surrounded by cherubs and an oil of Venice's Grand Canal is thought to be worth up to £5,000.

Bidders will be able to tour the property's English Heritage temple garden as well as the orangery, with a chance to purchase some of its statues. Among the more quirky items up for grabs are a Victorian saddlecloth and a signed photo of American president Theodore Roosevelt, [địa điểm bán tranh sơn mài tphcm](#) dated 1909. Potential buyers will be able to tour the building's interior as well as visit its gardens thanks to a five-day auction of hundreds of items contained at the site.
